#### **SECTION 4. FIRST-AID MEASURES**

#### **First-aid Measures**

#### Inhalation

Remove source of exposure or move to fresh air. Keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing. Get medical advice or attention if you feel unwell.

#### Skin Contact

Immediately rinse with lukewarm, gently flowing water for 15-20 minutes.

#### **Eye Contact**

Immediately rinse the contaminated eye(s) with lukewarm, gently flowing water for 15-20 minutes, while holding the eyelid(s) open. Immediately call a Poison Centre or doctor.

#### Ingestion

Rinse mouth with water. Do not induce vomiting. Immediately call a Poison Centre or doctor.

#### **First-aid Comments**

Some of the first-aid procedures recommended here require advanced first-aid training. If exposed or concerned, get medical advice or attention.

### Most Important Symptoms and Effects, Acute and Delayed

If on skin: contact can cause pain, redness, burns, and blistering. Permanent scarring can result. If in eyes: contact causes severe burns with redness, swelling, pain and blurred vision. Permanent damage including blindness can result.

## **SECTION 5. FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES**

## **Extinguishing Media**

### Suitable Extinguishing Media

Carbon dioxide, dry chemical powder, appropriate foam, water spray or fog. Use water to keep non-leaking, fire-exposed containers cool.

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### **Unsuitable Extinguishing Media**

None known.

### **Specific Hazards Arising from the Product**

Does not burn. Heating increases the release of toxic vapour. Closed containers may rupture violently when heated releasing contents.

In a fire, the following hazardous materials may be generated: Arsenic and its oxides.

### **Special Protective Equipment and Precautions for Fire-fighters**

Use extreme caution. Evacuate area. Approach fire from upwind to avoid hazardous vapours or gases. Fight fire from a protected, explosion-resistant location or maximum distance possible. Knock down vapours or gases with water fog or fine water spray. Before entry, especially into confined areas, use an appropriate monitor to check for: toxic gases or vapours, sufficient oxygen.

Chemical protective clothing (e.g. chemical splash suit) and positive pressure SCBA may be necessary.

### **SECTION 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES**

### Personal Precautions, Protective Equipment, and Emergency Procedures

Emergency responders: evacuate the area immediately. Isolate the hazard area. Keep out unnecessary and unprotected personnel. Evacuate downwind locations. Use the personal protective equipment recommended in Section 8 of this safety data sheet. Increase ventilation to area or move leaking container to a well-ventilated and secure area. Remove or isolate incompatible materials as well as other hazardous materials.

#### **Environmental Precautions**

Do not allow into any sewer, on the ground or into any waterway.

### Methods and Materials for Containment and Cleaning Up

Avoid generating dust. Collect using shovel/scoop or approved HEPA vacuum and place in a suitable container for disposal.

#### **Precautions for Safe Handling**

Wear personal protective equipment to avoid direct contact with this chemical. Obtain special instructions before use. Do not breathe in this product. Prevent accidental contact with incompatible chemicals. Keep containers tightly closed when not in use or empty.

#### **Conditions for Safe Storage**

Product (diluted as directed): store in an area that is: secure and separate from work areas. Protect from conditions listed in Conditions to Avoid in Section 10 (Stability and Reactivity). Comply with all applicable health and safety regulations, fire and building codes. Keep container tightly closed in a dry and well-ventilated place. Containers which are opened must be carefully resealed

and kept upright to prevent leakage.

Handle and store under inert gas. hygroscopic comply with all applicable health and safety regulations, fire and building codes.
