Inhalation

SECTION 5. FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

Extinguishing Media

Suitable Extinguishing Media

Not combustible. Use extinguishing agent suitable for surrounding fire. Use water to keep non-leaking, fire-exposed containers cool.

Specific Hazards Arising from the Product

Heating increases the release of toxic vapour. Closed containers may rupture violently when heated releasing contents. Decomposition by contact with water may generate vapours which can be ignited by heat or open flame. In a fire, the following hazardous materials may be generated: corrosive, oxidizing nitrogen oxides.

Special Protective Equipment and Precautions for Fire-fighters

Fight fire from a safe distance or a protected location. Knock down vapours or gases with water fog or fine water spray. For a massive fire, immediately evacuate the area and use unmanned hose holder or monitor nozzles. Dike and recover contaminated water for appropriate disposal.

Chemical protective clothing (e.g. chemical splash suit) and positive pressure SCBA may be necessary.

SECTION 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

Personal Precautions, Protective Equipment, and Emergency Procedures

Use the personal protective equipment recommended in Section 8 of this safety data sheet. Increase ventilation to area

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or move leaking container to a well-ventilated and secure area. Remove or isolate incompatible materials as well as other hazardous materials.

Environmental Precautions

Methods and Materials for Containment and Cleaning Up

Neutralize with Soda Ash or Lime, then absorb with Vermiculite, dry sand, or earth. Collect using shovel/scoop or approved HEPA vacuum and place in a suitable container for disposal.

Precautions for Safe Handling

Wear personal protective equipment to avoid direct contact with this chemical. Only use where there is adequate ventilation. Prevent accidental contact with incompatible chemicals.

Conditions for Safe Storage

Store in an area that is: cool, dry, well-ventilated. Store in a closed container.
