SECTION 4. FIRST-AID MEASURES

First-aid Measures

Inhalation

Remove source of exposure or move to fresh air. If breathing has stopped, trained personnel should begin rescue breathing. Seek immediate medical attention.

Skin Contact

Immediately rinse with lukewarm, gently flowing water for 15-20 minutes. Immediately call a Poison Centre or doctor.

Eye Contact

Immediately rinse the contaminated eye(s) with lukewarm, gently flowing water for 15-20 minutes, while holding the eyelid(s) open. Immediately call a Poison Centre or doctor.

Ingestion

Rinse mouth with water. Do not induce vomiting. Immediately call a Poison Centre or doctor.

SECTION 5. FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

Extinguishing Media

Suitable Extinguishing Media

Carbon dioxide, dry chemical powder, appropriate foam, water spray or fog.

Unsuitable Extinguishing Media

None known.

Specific Hazards Arising from the Product

Does not burn. Oxidizer. Releases oxygen to create an oxygen-rich atmosphere. Will cause combustible materials to ignite more readily. May cause or intensify fire. Heating increases the release of toxic vapour.

In a fire, the following hazardous materials may be generated: Potassium Oxide Chromium Oxide.

Special Protective Equipment and Precautions for Fire-fighters

As in any fire, wear self-contained breathing apparatus pressure-demand, MSHA/NIOSH (approved or equivalent) and full

protective gear. Move containers from fire area if it can be done without risk. Otherwise, use water in flooding quantities as a spray or fog to keep fire-exposed containers cool and absorb heat.

Chemical protective clothing (e.g. chemical splash suit) and positive pressure SCBA may be necessary.

SECTION 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

Personal Precautions, Protective Equipment, and Emergency Procedures

Evacuate the area immediately. Isolate the hazard area. Keep out unnecessary and unprotected personnel. Use the personal protective equipment recommended in Section 8 of this safety data sheet. Increase ventilation to area or move leaking container to a well-ventilated and secure area. Eliminate all ignition sources. Use grounded, explosion-proof equipment. Remove or isolate incompatible materials as well as other hazardous materials.

Environmental Precautions

Do not allow into any sewer, on the ground or into any waterway.

Methods and Materials for Containment and Cleaning Up

Collect using shovel/scoop or approved HEPA vacuum and place in a suitable container for disposal. Avoid dry sweeping. If necessary, use a dust suppressant such as water. Do not use compressed air for clean-up. Store recovered product in suitable containers that are: tightly-covered.

SECTION 7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

Precautions for Safe Handling

Wear personal protective equipment to avoid direct contact with this chemical. Avoid generating dusts. Only use where there is adequate ventilation. Keep away from heat, hot surfaces, sparks, open flames and other ignition sources. No smoking. Prevent accidental contact with incompatible chemicals. Prevent accidental contact with flammable and combustible materials. Keep containers tightly closed when not in use or empty. Wash hands thoroughly after handling this material.

Conditions for Safe Storage

Store in an area that is: dry, well-ventilated, separate from incompatible materials (see Section 10: Stability and Reactivity), clear of combustible and flammable materials (e.g. old rags, cardboard).

*NOTICE OF INTENDED CHANGE: ACGIH has published a Notice of Intended Change to revise the TLV-TWA to 0.0002 mg/m3 (Inhalable particulate matter) as Cr(VI) and to establish a TLV-STEL of 0.0005 mg/m3 (Inhalable particulate matter) as Cr(VI) with a Carcinogenicity designation of A1 (Hexavalent chromium compounds, including Chromite ore processing). In addition, water soluble compounds, like potassium dichromate, are proposed to have a Skin notation, a Dermal sensitization notation, and a Respiratory sensitization notation. The proposed TLV Basis is lung and sinonasal cancer, respiratory tract irritation and asthma.

A1 = Confirmed human carcinogen.
