#### Hazard Statement(s):

Toxic if swallowed.

### Precautionary Statement(s):

#### Response:

## **SECTION 4. FIRST-AID MEASURES**

#### **First-aid Measures**

#### Inhalation

Remove source of exposure or move to fresh air. Keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing. If breathing is difficult, trained personnel should administer emergency oxygen if advised to do so by Poison Centre or doctor.

#### **Skin Contact**

Immediately rinse with lukewarm, gently flowing water for 15-20 minutes. Immediately call a Poison Centre or doctor.

#### **Eye Contact**

Immediately rinse the contaminated eye(s) with lukewarm, gently flowing water for 15-20 minutes, while holding the eyelid(s) open. If eye irritation persists, get medical advice or attention.

### Ingestion

Rinse mouth with water. Do not induce vomiting. Immediately call a Poison Centre or doctor.

## **First-aid Comments**

### SECTION 5. FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

## **Extinguishing Media**

## Suitable Extinguishing Media

Carbon dioxide, dry chemical powder, appropriate foam, water spray or fog. Use water to keep non-leaking, fire-exposed containers cool.

#### **Unsuitable Extinguishing Media**

None known.

#### **Specific Hazards Arising from the Product**

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Does not burn. Heating increases the release of toxic vapour. Closed containers may rupture violently when heated releasing contents.

In a fire, the following hazardous materials may be generated: corrosive hydrogen fluoride.

## **Special Protective Equipment and Precautions for Fire-fighters**

Fight fire from a safe distance or a protected location. Approach fire from upwind to avoid hazardous vapours or gases. Knock down vapours or gases with water fog or fine water spray. For a massive fire, immediately evacuate the area and use unmanned hose holder or monitor nozzles. Dike and recover contaminated water for appropriate disposal.

Chemical protective clothing (e.g. chemical splash suit) and positive pressure SCBA may be necessary.

## **SECTION 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES**

### Personal Precautions, Protective Equipment, and Emergency Procedures

Evacuate downwind locations. Use the personal protective equipment recommended in Section 8 of this safety data sheet. Increase ventilation to area or move leaking container to a well-ventilated and secure area. Remove or isolate incompatible materials as well as other hazardous materials.

#### **Environmental Precautions**

Do not allow into any sewer, on the ground or into any waterway.

### Methods and Materials for Containment and Cleaning Up

Avoid generating dust. Stop or reduce leak if safe to do so. Collect using shovel/scoop or approved HEPA vacuum and place in a suitable container for disposal. Flush spill area. Dike and recover contaminated water for appropriate disposal.

#### **SECTION 7. HANDLING AND STORAGE**

## **Precautions for Safe Handling**

Avoid generating dusts. Only use where there is adequate ventilation. Wear personal protective equipment to avoid direct contact with this chemical. Never add water to a corrosive. Always add corrosives slowly to COLD water. Prevent accidental contact with incompatible chemicals. Avoid release to the environment. Keep containers tightly closed when not in use or empty. Wash hands thoroughly after handling this product and before eating, using the washroom or leaving work area.

## **Conditions for Safe Storage**

Store in an area that is: well-ventilated, separate from incompatible materials (see Section 10: Stability and Reactivity). Store in the original, labelled, shipping container. Protect from conditions listed in Conditions to Avoid in Section 10 (Stability and Reactivity).
